REHVA, the Federation of European Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning associations is an umbrella organization that represent over 120,000 HVAC designers, building services engineers, technicians and experts across 27 European Countries. REHVA will address the technical challenges tackled by QUEST and influencing investors' behaviour: as they realise more and more that the increased technical complexity of buildings, they seek a methodology actively monitoring and verifying the quality of any building work to make sure that the required performances they paid for are achieved.

The core of the QUEST vision is the awareness that problems arising with buildings' energy performance and comfort are not caused by inappropriate technology and lack of conceptual intelligence but by the absence of technical monitoring and quality management throughout the building life cycle that affects the actual building performance. The QUEST partners will develop a methodology to fill in this gap and de-risk investments in sustainable and energy efficient buildings.

Climate Finance Day 2019

QUEST representatives from COPILOT Building Commissioning Certification attended Climate Finance Day 2019. Green Finance and carbon footprint were focal points. The finance industry wants easy-to-use green finance tools. It is increasing integrating to environmental considerations following COP21, the Principles of Responsible Investment/Banking (PRI/PRB) and other initiatives.
